### Fire Management in Kananaskis Country Thursday, Feb. 19, 2015: - 7:00pm - 8:00pm

Presented by Scott Jevons, Geographical Information Systems (GIS) Specialist and Fire Ecologist with Alberta Parks in Kananaskis Country

Effective control of wildfires over the last century has led to the near-elimination of fires that once shaped the vegetation of Alberta. Loss of fire from the landscape is causing dramatic changes to our forests and grasslands, affecting species diversity, how ecosystems function, and the resilience of ecosystems to natural disturbances and changing climate. Come and take a historical walk through time to view landscape change in Kananaskis Country, and learn how Alberta Parks is dealing with these complex challenges.

12 WEEK WINTER BIRDING COURSE STARTS MONDAY, JANUARY, 5, 2015



Learn about the variety of bird species in Fish Creek Provincial Park and other natural areas in Calgary through the Friends of Fish Creek Winter Birding Course. Birds are now easier to see as the trees have shed their leaves, there are fewer species present and they often occur in large flocks. As a fundraiser for the Friends of Fish Creek, these outings will be conducted by lifelong birder and naturalist Gus Yaki and other experienced birding instructors.

The goal of this project was to restore a heavily damaged section of stream bank by planting willows, poplars and dogwoods, and installing large woody debris and signage to deter future off-trail use. # Rick and Elaine Barnes Dedicated to Preserving Fish Creek for Present and Future Generations

We are pleased to announce new members emeritus, Rick and Elaine Barnes, in recognition of an incredibly generous donation. Rick and Elaine Barnes are our newest Lifetime Members and their donation will go a long way in helping the Friends to continue engaging the public in a variety of ways throughout the year for the long term sustainability of this park.

Originally from Walkerton, Ontario Elaine moved to Calgary in 1980 and married Rick in 1989. After 1 year in Winnipeg, they returned to Calgary and chose to live near Fish Creek Provincial Park. "We now live in Deer River Estates backing on to this magnificent park where we have the opportunity to view the wildlife from our windows," Elaine said, "Having grown up on a farm I was so impressed that this open space existed in the midst of a growing city and that it would never be developed. My initial impression was how lucky I am to have such easy access to this space. Rick and I still feel that every day when we enter the park. There is rarely a day that I am not in the park walking, running or cycling. Prior to my retirement earlier this year I was in the park at 5:30 am most days. This was a time to not only exercise but to think about the day ahead. I would frequently see a deer, coyote, owl or some other wildlife that would remind me of how lucky I am to have access to the park. I am happy to say I can now enjoy the park in the daylight at a civilized hour. Friends and family who visit us from other areas of Canada are amazed at this wonderful resource in our backyard."

Since they first began visiting the park, Elaine and Rick have noticed significant changes within Fish Creek Provincial Park. "The floods of 2005 and 2013, as well as the engineered wetlands, have certainly changed the area. The once quiet stream that runs off the Bow around Popular Island has significant water flow and is deeper in many areas," she informed, "I would say the use of the park has also gone up significantly. This is not based on any numbers I have but just on the numbers of people we see in the park."

They originally heard about the Friends of Fish Creek 12 years ago when Elaine came across a memorial bench. "I thought it was such a wonderful idea to honour someone and decided at that point we would donate a bench so we could use it, and have it in a spot where other park

users would stop and have an opportunity to reflect and enjoy the area. It has been my greatest pleasure to see someone taking a time out on our bench," Elaine stated, "Once we became members of the Friends of Fish Creek, we realized that this organization was educating people on wildlife and other ecological areas of importance to our future. We became regular donors because this work needs to continue for future generations to enjoy the park."

Elaine would like to share one message with the readers of this newsletter, "Fish Creek Provincial Park is an incredible resource that we need to continue to take care of. The funding of organizations like the Friends of Fish Creek, who support the park and educate park users, is vital for the continued evolution and long-term sustainability of Fish Creek Provincial Park."

### **Quiz Answer**

The mule deer and the white-tailed deer can be seen in the park throughout the year and they often appear in groups of 3 - 7 individuals. During the winter months you may see them walking through the snow and nibbling on exposed vegetation. Deer flourish in Fish Creek Provincial Park because there are very few natural predators and abundant food sources. Deer can be seen at almost anytime of the day and are often spotted next to roadways in the park. Although young deer may appear friendly and even harmless, like other wildlife, they will flee or defend themselves if they feel threatened. Always respect the deer by not trying to feed them and by keeping your dog on a leash at all times in the park. Keep in mind that these captivating animals are accustomed to people and are not averse to being photographed from a distance.
