
FAREWELL VOLUNTEERS AND MEMBERS SEE YOU IN THE AUTUMN!

12 Week Winter Birding Course Starts Monday, January 9, 2017



Learn about the variety of bird species in Fish Creek Provincial Park and other natural areas within Calgary through the Friends of Fish Creek Provincial Park Society's Winter Birding Course. In the winter months, birds are much easier to see since the deciduous trees have shed their leaves, there are fewer species present and they often occur in flocks. "In fact, there may well be more individual birds within Calgary during the winter than in the summer months," said lifelong naturalist Gus Yaki, who, along with other experienced birding instructors, conducts these outings as a fundraiser for the Friends of Fish Creek.

Choose to come on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays or Thursdays at 9:15am, Saturdays at 9:00am, or on Sundays at 9:00am or 1:15pm.

SUCCESSFUL PARK WATCH EDUCATION AND OUTREACH TO DOG OWNERS Article by Park Watch Stewards Carl and Liz Johnson

One of the issues that has occurred in Fish Creek Provincial Park over the years is the "doggie bags" left by a few dog walkers. Although most will get picked up by Park Watch teams and caring visitors to the park, it has been a constant source of frustration to volunteers and visitors. We have found these little "gems" left beside the trail, thrown into the trees off the trail and even tied to branches.

Last spring, we initiated a pilot trial in Shannon Terrace and approached Tim Horton's in Braeside to provide coupons for a free hot drink to the Friends of Fish Creek Park Watch Program. They gave us 60 coupons to start with. These coupons were handed out to any dog walker that picked up after their pet and disposed of it properly. Over the summer approximately 40 coupons were given out and generated a lot of positive discussions between Park Watchers and the responsible dog owners. Hopefully the word will spread and eventually the abandoned doggie bags will disappear. The dinosaurs did, so this should be a small feat.

Tim Horton's deserves a huge thank you for their support and although during our shifts this year the doggie bags were fewer than last year, we cannot correlate back to this initiative – yet. With the help of Tim Horton's, we plan to continue the program next year and perhaps try to expand to other areas of the park.

The Friends staff would also like to express our thanks to Carl and Liz for suggesting and spearheading this great new addition to the program this year!

In March of this year, which member of the park's wildlife community was found wandering in the Shawnessy area?

On the morning of March 30, City Police received a call about a moose in the Shawnessy Superstore parking lot. The area was fenced off from nearby Macleod Trail, which helped protect morning commuters as well as the young female moose. Wildlife like moose will sometimes enter neighbourhoods surrounding green spaces like Fish Creek Provincial Park to feed on ornamental shrubs in peoples' yards. Alberta Fish and Wildlife Officers managed to tranquilize the animal just before 9am and she was safely relocated to Kananaskis Country.
