Beaches, Birds, and the Boreal Forest: Lesser Slave Lake Provincial Park



Ever since I moved to Calgary six years ago, I have wanted to volunteer

and spend time in Fish Creek Provincial Park, but without a vehicle, it was difficult for me to get to the park as much as I wanted. In 2015, that changed and I signed up for every volunteer opportunity that I could and in the process learned many things about the park and the Friends of Fish Creek.

Now I am very pleased to have the opportunity to be here as Program Assistant while Katie is on leave. When I started in December I was very excited and a little nervous, but everyone I have met so far, and all the messages I received, have been so friendly and heartwarming that my nervousness has melted away. I am so glad to be part of the Friends of Fish Creek team.

I was born in Hiroshima, Japan spent time in Tokyo and Nagasaki, and later attended Shimani University to study forest ecology and receive my master's degree. As a child, I loved animals and was always playing outdoors. I originally wanted to be a veterinarian, but then one day I thought, "If I were a vet, I would have to wait in a clinic until the animals got injured or sick. That's not what I want." It was a very serious thought for a young child to have, but it lead to my career path. Even at a young age I knew what I wanted to do: I wanted to protect wild animals and their habitats.

After graduation, I worked as a field interpreter for tourists and worked in the field of wild bear management in Nagano, Japan. During my career, I led various tours, developed wild bear programs, and worked to help resolve conflicts between bear and human activities. I loved my job and the opportunity to work outdoors.

I moved to Calgary when my husband got a job here, and even though it was not my choice to live here, I have found that this city has many benefits and opportunities. We are so close to the mountains here and have Fish Creek Provincial Park right inside the city! In 2016, I volunteered for Friends of Fish Creek programs like Restoration, Wellness, Youth Nature, Fish Creek Speaker Series and many others, and was delighted to receive the New and Noteworthy Volunteer of the Year award last November. I am so glad to be working in this beautiful park and am looking forward to seeing and working with all of you!

The course will take place outdoors in Fish Creek Provincial Park and other natural areas within Calgary. March 23 – Spring Cleaning and Detox


April 20 – Connecting to Earth

QUIZ ANSWER - DEC / JAN ISSUE

Shaw's Meadow in Fish Creek was named after the Shaw Family. In which year did the Shaws arrive in the area?

Samuel William Shaw and his wife Helen arrived in the spring of 1883 and settled along Fish Creek near current day Macleod Trail. They came from Kent, England to make a new life in the unsettled Canadian west. Together they established Alberta's first industry, a woolen mill that could manufacture up to 300 lbs of wool per day. Helen Shaw opened Midnapore Woolen Mills in downtown Calgary in the area currently known as Stephen Ave and sold skirts, blankets and other woolen products. Many Yukon Gold Rush prospectors also purchased clothing from the store. The south east neighbourhood of Shawnessy was named after this important family and Millrise was named after the Shaw's woollen mill. FCP Park Notes thedeepsouth.ca
