Alberta has over 300 native bee species but most research and attention is focused on a handful of managed species. Our native bees face many of the same threats as managed bees, in addition to competition for food caused by the increasing presence of non-native, managed bees. More awareness of the diversity and conservation issues surrounding our native bees is needed.

In 2017, the Alberta Native Bee Council was formed. The mission of the ANBC is to promote conservation of native pollinator communities through research and monitoring, advocacy, education, and collaboration to realize healthy and resilient native pollinator populations and habitat in Alberta.

THE JOBBER'S HOUSE AT THE BOW VALLEY RANCH

RENOVATION TO SUPPORT FRIENDS' GROWTH AND EXPANSION

The 100 year old house that stands next to our office in Fish Creek Provincial Park has remained empty since the late 1950s. This is the Jobber's House. This building was part of the ranch upgrades carried out by Patrick Burns in 1918, and is one of only three buildings remaining from the Burns period, a significant time for the ranching industry in Canada.



This house has been part of the charm of Fish Creek Provincial Park for three generations and community members constantly tell us how much the building means to them. The Friends of Fish Creek is in growth mode and we require additional space to develop our social enterprise programs, add staff and respond to the demand for our programs, and further support the community and other non profits.

We are proposing to take over and renovate and repurpose the Jobber's House to support our growth, further support our community, provide a facility to serve as a hub for less established non-profit groups and ensure the survival of this piece of Calgary's history.

In order to raise funds for the actual upgrades and repurposing we need a plan from a qualified individual supporting the feasibility of the project and outlining the steps to complete it and a cost estimate.

After some discussions in the early part of the year and support from local MLAs Richard Gotfried and Graham Sucha we are very happy to announce that the Alberta

Real Estate Foundation has provided a grant to cover the full cost of the feasibility study and project plan. Their generous contribution of \$44,000 will go a long way in getting this project off the ground.

The plan will take around three months to complete, once we have this, we will

be able to commence fundraising for the actual construction work. After discussions with supporters and potential funders, we estimate the major fundraising will take around a year to complete.

The current idea is to convert the upstairs to one large versatile room to support many functions, the downstairs will contain a smaller meeting space and possibly office space, the basement will contain utilities, washroom and office space. The exterior will be renovated but will maintain the same appearance. We are considering adding a classroom to the rear of the building to increase its utility; this will be constructed in keeping with the current exterior.

The work will include bringing the building up to current code and accessibility requirements and using energy and water conserving technologies. Our sincere thanks to the AREF for supporting the Jobber's House Renovation and the Friends look forward to sharing our progress on this exciting project.

WINTER BIRDING COURSE

January 7 - March 31, 2019

Learn about the variety of bird species in Fish Creek Provincial Park and other natural areas within Calgary through the Friends of Fish Creek Winter Birding Course. In the winter months, birds are much easier to see since the deciduous trees have shed their leaves, there are fewer species present and they often occur in flocks. "In fact, there may well be more individual birds within Calgary during the winter than in the summer months," said lifelong naturalist Gus Yaki, who, along with other experienced birding instructors, conducts these outings as a fundraiser for the Friends of Fish Creek.

SHAW BIRDIES FOR KIDS PRESENTED BY ALTALINK

The Shaw Birdies for Kids presented by AltaLink Matching Donation program (BFK) supports thousands of children in the Calgary area. Community members can donate to the 180 local charities who run childrens' programs and donations are matched up to 50% by the Shaw Charity Classic Foundation. In total BFK raised \$12,357,863 for local charities this year! Birdies for Kids runs from April until the close of the Shaw Charity Classic Golf Tournament, held at the end of August at Canyon Meadows Golf & Country Club.

We raised \$1,481 through fundraising efforts over the spring and summer, which translated into just over \$2,220 after the BFK contribution. This year we explored new strategies like the distribution of a poster and a draw by donation fundraiser with a grand prize of an afghan, hand-crafted by Friends volunteer Doreen Fulton.

QUIZ ANSWER - OCT / NOV ISSUE

Which bird species was featured on page 1 of the Oct/Nov newsletter?

The bird is the Pileated Woodpecker (see page 6) and it was photographed by Shirley Otway. This is the largest of the woodpeckers and measures between 41 - 48 cm in length. Usually a solitary bird, the Pileated Woodpecker has been spotted in the Burnsmead, Votier's Flats, Bebo Grove, and Bow Valley Ranch areas of Fish Creek, as well as in Griffith Woods Park, Weaselhead, and Carburn Park. Its habitat includes mature mixed forests and areas with dead or dying trees. These birds are easily identifiable because they are mostly black, with a white neck, bright red crest on their head, and a long pointed beak, perfectly designed for boring holes in trees and digging out tasty ants, beetles, berries and nuts. A rectangular hole, about the size of a fist, found at the base of a dead tree is a good indication that one of these birds was feeding in that area. Learn more about the Pileated Woodpecker and many other bird species that can be seen in the winter months through the Winter Birding Course, starting January 7.
