Watershed Stewardship Program Description	The Friends of Fish Creek coordinate many environmental stewardship projects in the park, such as Weed Whackers, Tree Wrapping and Clean-Ups with the goal of raising awareness about issues impacting the health of Fish Creek while simultaneously engaging the community in meaningful activities that contribute to improved watershed health.
Overall Role of Stewardship Crew Leader	To independently lead stewardship-focused outings with small groups of volunteers.
Desired Outcomes	The goal of our Stewardship programs is to educate and raise awareness among outing participants regarding the issue at hand, whether it be invasive species, beaver activity, littering or the potentially harmful impact of human off-trail use in riparian zones while simultaneously making a positive impact on an area of the park.
Tasks & Responsibilities <i>(will vary depending on which programs the Volunteer position relates to directly)</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sign up for shifts using <i>MyVolunteerPage</i> • Host outings that engage volunteers (greeting & signing in volunteers, going over safety orientation, assignment instructions/demonstration to volunteers, taking photos) • Maintain communication with Friends' staff re: outing status via cellphone • Professionally represent the Friends of Fish Creek • Wear appropriate and protective clothing/equipment to ensure personal safety, and dress for the weather; bring personal water, sunscreen, hat, etc. • Supervise and ensure safe use of tools and equipment • Submit report after each outing to Friends' staff • Participate in various tasks related to stewardship projects
Requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sign and submit Friends of Fish Creek Volunteer Agreement • Acknowledge the Friends of Fish Creek Volunteer Handbook on MVP profile • Basic computer/internet literacy and working email account • Working, charged cellphone with Friends'/ABParks contact numbers pre-programmed • Friendly and professional interpersonal skills • Sound physical condition and awareness of personal abilities and limitations • Ability to identify native and invasive plants is an asset (but not necessary)
Time Commitment	Available to host 1-2 stewardship outings (2-4hrs each) per month from May to October.
Training	Training will be provided by Friends' staff and on-site mentoring available as needed.
Evaluation	Feedback will be provided during mentoring shifts and following receipt of report following each outing. Volunteers will also be invited to complete an end-of-season Volunteer Experience Survey to provide feedback back to the organization.
