# BOW VALLEY RANCH VISITOR CENTRE RE-OPENING

If you have been to the Bow Valley Ranch area of Fish Creek Provincial Park, you have most likely seen the large '70s era-looking building across the pathway from the Cookhouse. This is the Bow Valley Ranch Visitor Centre and while you have most likely seen the building, have you gone inside and walked around the exhibit area? In the centre, visitors can discover the fascinating history of this city and park dating back from prehistoric times all the way to the current day, and even see archaeological artifacts from historical areas in the park. The centre is accessible to all park visitors and is located close to the Bow Valley Ranche Restaurant, Annie's, the Artisan Gardens, the creek itself, the Bow River and a variety of trails and pathways.

Unfortunately, in recent years provincial funding restrictions have resulted in the centre being closed most of the time, and since the start of the pandemic last spring, the centre has been closed to the public. In the autumn of 2020, the Friends of Fish Creek and Alberta Environment and Parks embarked on the Enhanced Partnership Project. This project is designed to help the Friends increase our capacity to support the park and in turn provide more benefits to the community. One of the many projects we are collaborating on is the opening of the Bow Valley Ranch Visitor Centre.

The Friends are very excited to be able to re-open the Bow Valley Ranch Visitor Centre with the support of Alberta Environment and Parks. Trained volunteers, known as Fish Creek Ambassadors, will be working in the centre to provide information and answer questions for park visitors. Fish Creek Ambassadors will also collect information about the number of visitors and the reason for their visit - a practice that will allow us to better understand how the park is being used and how often. This type or information will give us the



ability to enhance our current programs and develop new programs that will benefit both the park and members of the public.


Our goal is to work with volunteers and the park to ensure that the Visitor Centre is open year-round. A staged opening is planned that will begin with having the centre open for a few hours on weekdays, and gradually increasing hours of operation. Through the Bow Valley Ranch Visitor Centre project, our dedicated volunteers who know the Friends, know our programs and know the park, will act the first point of contact with park visitors.

Due to current Covid-19 regulations, there is no firm date on when the Visitor Centre can be opened. Once we can continue with the opening there will be more information sent out to your emails and on our social media channels. We hope once the Visitor Centre is up and running, that you come down and say hello to the Ambassadors and take a walk around the exhibit.

# BUILDING OUR WELLNESS PROGRAM

Since 2013, the Friends have offered our Wellness Program as a way to engage the public in various outdoor activities that support mind, body and spirit. Starting with yoga and meditation sessions in that first year, we later branched out to include other offerings



Each year is a bit different, as we rely on the time and expertise of volunteer instructors to lead these programs. We are currently working on planning our 2021 Wellness Program, and with that, are reaching out to the community in search of one or two additional Instructors to help us round out this year's suite of offerings. Professional certification (or being in the process of achieving this in their area of specialty) is preferred, but not mandatory. A one-season commitment is perfect (June through August), after which, together we can assess the program and discuss its continuation in subsequent years.



All programs take place at the Bow Valley Ranch, however it may be possible for programming to occur at a different location. If you have a background in wellness and are interested in discussing this opportunity, please contact Shana Barbour, Social

#### BEAVERS IN FISH CREEK PROVINCIAL PARK

## BUILDING PATHWAYS TO COEXISTENCE

Thanks to the financial support of Alberta Environment and Parks' Watershed Resiliency and Restoration Program, the Friends spearheaded our first ever Beaver Coexistence Project in 2020. The goals of this project are project also to mitigate the negative impacts of beaver activity and to raise awareness about the positive effects of beavers on the environment.

The project focused on the area between Marshall Springs and Bebo Grove, where beaver activity had caused long-term flooding and the closure of a stretch of pathway that was once part of a nice loop for visitors to walk, run or cycle. To the public, it may have seemed that nothing was being done. However, we were working to foster coexistence with our furry friends by securing funds and support in order to develop a comprehensive plan to deal with the situation.

In September 2020, the Friends of Fish Creek hosted a three-day workshop to assess the site, and assemble and install a series of flow control devices. These coexistence structures manage water levels to alleviate pathway flooding while allowing the beavers the depth of water they require to survive winter. With our partners at You Betula Environmental, we have developed a team of Beaver Coexistence Volunteers who monitor the sites regularly, record observations into our digital app and carry out necessary maintenance to help ensure project success. A huge thank you to all our Beaver Coexistence Volunteers, especially to our two lead volunteers, Rose and Will Ratliffe!

Although the flooding has been alleviated, the pathway remains closed due to the damage sustained while submerged. Our partners at AEP will be deciding the best course of action on the pathway pending project success and good trail design.

The Fish Creek Beaver Coexistence featured 11 tours for public, partners and land managers



from other jurisdictions, three beaver-focused Fish Creek Speaker Series presentations and seven pop-up outreach stations, engaging over 1,300 individuals so far.

The work will continue in 2021, with plans to host another event similar to the 2020 Living with Beavers event, more pop-up outreach and a video showcasing the project. We are excited to continue this work and hope to see you at a tour or outreach table in the park this year! For more information stay tuned to https:// friendsoffishcreek.org/beavers/

Beaver Coexistence: Flow Control Device Monitoring and Maintenance Program (T, F, S)

#### ReWilding Site Monitors (T, F, S)

Take part in monitoring our restoration sites and take notes using the ArcGIS digital app. Maintenance tasks could include adding additional tree cages, pruning, staking, flagging, weeding, and so much more!

#### Weed Watchers (T, F)

Invasive weeds are pervasive throughout Fish Creek Provincial Park, and we need your help to locate and remove them! Pair up with a teammate and use our digital app to note the location of invasives and remove these problematic plants.

#### Fish Creek Ambassadors (T, S, PIC/VSC)

Fish Creek Ambassadors will be volunteering in the Bow Valley Ranch Visitor Centre providing information about Fish Creek Provincial Park and the Friends programs, as well as gathering information and data about how people use the Visitor Centre.

#### Stewardship Truck Crew (T, F)

With the addition of our stewardship truck, we will need helping hands to ensure our ReWilding sites are maintained, whether it be watering or fence maintenance! Make connections by working in a small team and provide direct assistance for the success of our ReWilding sites.

# WHO USES CALGARY PARKS?

Through the <u>Calgary Captured</u> citizen science program over 70 wildlife remote cameras were installed in 17 parks across the city, including Fish Creek Provincial Park. Photos taken by these cameras help us to learn more about urban wildlife, how they use green spaces as travel corridors to support their movement throughout the city, and how they respond to the dynamics of the built environment (ie what kinds of things get in the way of their safe movement, and the importance of connectivity of these green spaces).

The Friends have enjoyed the unique opportunity to partner with the Miistakis Institute and other community partners on

this project since 2018, with our volunteers playing a critical behind the scenes role to maintain the wildlife cameras in our park, and the classification of photos from their cameras through an online platform called Wildtrax.

Since the project started, over 1,800,000 photos have been captured by the remote cameras across the city. The species in each photo have to be identified, classified and validated by several volunteers, so – as you can imagine – this takes quite a bit of time! In the fall of 2020, a full year's worth of data analysis was shared by the Miistakis Institute, highlighting the frequency of each species identification associated with the various parks across the city. Not surprisingly,

white tailed and mule deer were captured the most, followed by coyotes and hares. The table on the previous page shows the full results, which can also be found on the Calgary Captured website.



While Friends' volunteers have a big role to play in this program, and anyone can help out with the identification of wildlife through Zooniverse and be part of this important project! Simply go to Zooniverse.org and search for Calgary Captured, to begin identifying species. You can also go that extra step by clicking on the #talk button on the last screen

before you submit your observation to let them know if you found something really great!

#### QUIZ ANSWER - AUTUMN ISSUE

#### In what year, and where in Fish Creek Provincial Park, did the first Riparian Restoration project take place?

In 2013, the Friends worked with Alberta Riparian Habitat Management Society (Cows and Fish) to complete a Riparian Health Inventory along the creek between Bridge 11 and the confluence with the Bow River. In October 2014, three restoration events were executed. Volunteers first dug post holes and erected posts for the signage. The volunteers then harvested willow, dogwood and poplar cuttings from other areas of Fish Creek, and finally they planted poplar seedlings and willow cuttings, spread mulch and installed informational signage.
