Birds in the Park

Fish Creek Provincial Park is an oasis of nature surrounded by urban development. The various habitats in the Park offer refuge for a wide variety of bird species. Without this natural area and others like it in the city, many of these birds would not be able to exist in Calgary. Fish Creek offers birds places to feed, nest, and raise young, but is also a resting spot for spring and fall migrants as well as a permanent home to many year round residents.

Tips for Observing Birds

wildlife in the Park.

- Stop, look, and listen. Birds may be all around you.
- Observe birds and other wildlife from a safe distance. Do not disturb nesting sights or birds with young. Ensure that your pets are leashed and under control so as not to chase birds or other animals.
- **Do not feed the birds.** The animals in the Park are wild and there is plenty of food for them in the natural environment of the Park. Feeding birds and other animals may cause them to see people as a source of food and loose their natural fear of us. The food you offer birds may not be very healthy for them and could lead to illness. It is also unlawful to feed all
- Do not venture off trail in search of birds, you risk injury to yourself and damage to the natural environment that the very bird you are seeking relies upon.
- Explore the different habitats of the Park. Prairie, forest, pond, and river environments are home to different types of birds. The more habitats you visit, the greater variety of birds you can find.
- Join other bird watchers more eyes and ears lead to more sightings.
