Position Title	Good Grief Companion

Good Grief Program Description (part of the Wellness Program)	The Friends of Fish Creek, Mount Royal University and Alberta Parks have partnered to offer <i>Good Grief: Nature Walking Through Grief and Loss</i> . This program targets people working through a significant life transition and who may benefit from a shared experience in nature with others on a similar journey. <i>Goof Grief</i> is intended to create a space for participants to grieve, mourn, discover and heal through connecting with the park landscape, its natural cycles and each other. It is not a medical or counselling-based program, although experiencing the support of nature and community may have therapeutic benefits.
Overall Role of Good Grief Companion	To provide a safe and supportive park experience for program participants who are experiencing grief or loss.
Desired Outcomes	<ul> <li>Creation of an emotionally-supportive community via shared experience</li> <li>Heightened awareness of natural/historical/cultural or other features in the park that encourage participants to return to visit the park on their own time</li> <li>Continuation of participant relationships formed through this program via Friends' support and direction</li> </ul>
Tasks & Responsibilities  Requirements	<ul> <li>Sign up for shifts and log hours using MylMpact</li> <li>Participate in the completion/review of the First and Last Five Minutes forms for each shift</li> <li>Interact professionally and compassionately with participants</li> <li>Safely lead walks by following the planned route and using basic group management techniques, being aware of potential hazards associated with outdoor programs</li> <li>Professionally represent the Friends</li> <li>Manage participant sign-in and complete safety checklist and shift reports</li> <li>Be emotionally and appropriately available to support participants while maintaining personal and professional boundaries</li> <li>Facilitate connection between participants as needed as well as miniactivities (ex. encourage reflection, personal sharing, journaling, etc.)</li> <li>Sharing program content (readings, poems, etc.) with the group</li> <li>Picking up/dropping off program supplies before/after program outings</li> <li>Complete Friends of Fish Creek Volunteer Agreement</li> <li>Clear Police Information and Vulnerable Sector Checks (1st-yr vols only)</li> <li>Carry fully-charged personal cell phone</li> <li>Friendly, supportive and professional interpersonal skills</li> <li>Ability to actively and compassionately listen without feeling the need to solve problems or offer advice</li> <li>Basic computer/internet literacy and working email account</li> <li>Reliable transportation and willingness to travel to different park locations</li> <li>Ability to comfortably walk or wheel (for those using wheelchairs or walkers) 2-4km</li> </ul>
Time Commitment	An average of 2-3 hours per week from October 19th to November 30th, including training and program outings
Training	Mandatory completion of <i>Good Grief</i> volunteer training
Evaluation	Ongoing and via participant Program Feedback forms. We welcome feedback from volunteers throughout the season and will send out a formal Volunteer Experience Survey at the end of the season.
