


SEED HARVEST Guide



WHEN TO HARVEST?

- In general seed is ready when it is hard, dry and dark in colour (brown to beige). The seed should be easy to slide off. The seed is NOT ready when green and squishy
 - For flowering plants after the plant has no petals left
 - For grasses, the seed head has been present for at least a few weeks
 - If it's a fleshy fruit (saskatoon berry/ rose hip) the "berry" will be hard, shriveled, dry, and mould free





HOW TO HARVEST?



1. Cut of seed head

2. Put seeds in paper bag and label accordingly

3. Bring collected seeds to The Friends, or store in a cool, dry place for future use!

<u>Capsule</u>

- Seeds found in calyx (tube)
- Cut off seed head & shake well in plastic bag

- Open seam along pod
- Pop seeds out

Use strainer to separate seeds from flesh


