ABOUT MISSOURI GOLDENROD

Give your garden a pollinator-friendly boost with sunny yellow goldenrod.

This native perennial is a low-growing prairie species that spreads by rhizomes, forming clumps that will light up your garden when blooming.

Since goldenrod is a clumping plant, you can divide it every three to four years if you would like to pass plants on to others.

CARE INSTRUCTIONS

- Caring for me is easy! After transplanting me into your garden, water me right away, daily for the first 3 days then weekly or if I'm looking sad!
- Once established, I don't require a lot of water. If I'm planted in a space where there's snow cover, the spring melt should be sufficient for new growth each year.
- If I'm looking a little sad or wilted, or the space I'm in doesn't get snow, give me enough water to soak my root ball to perk me up.
